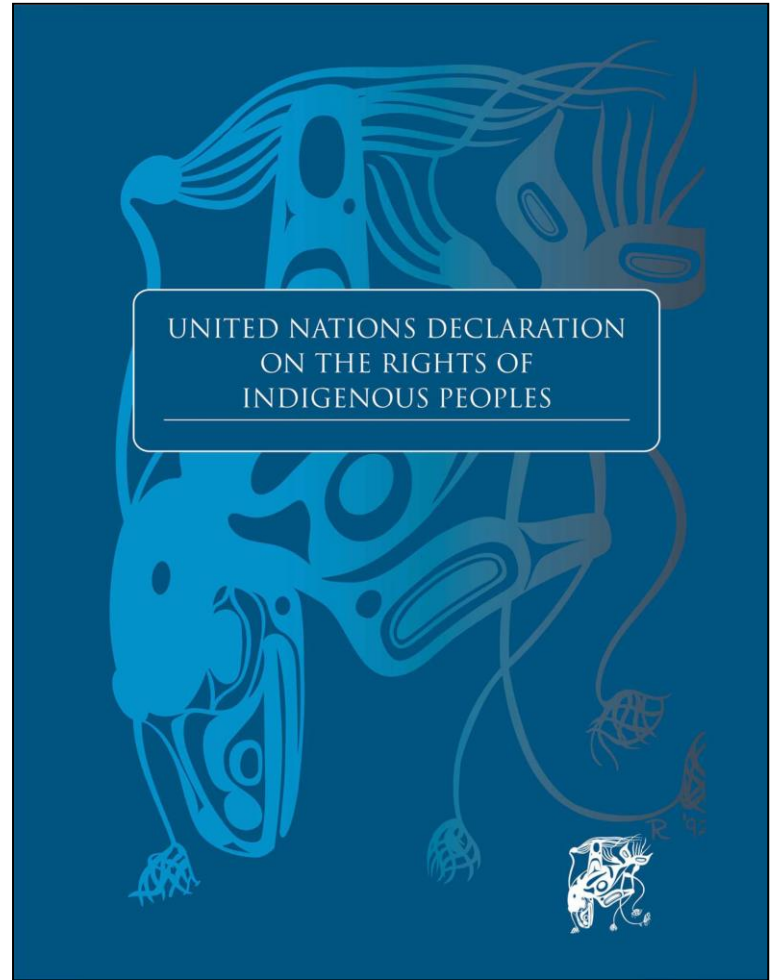


# Consent or Consultation: Examining the Gap

The Supreme Court of Canada has recognized a duty to consult First Nations on issues affecting their rights.
